Primary School Sports Grant Impact and Evaluation Report Academic Year 2017/18

Context of Academy

Whetley Academy is situated in inner city Bradford. We are a large two/three form entry school.

The school has two halls, one situated in the KS1 building and one in the KS2 building. We also have two football pitches which we use for a wide range of sports and two main playground areas.

Whetley Academy has strong links with other Bradford schools. Throughout the year our pupils attend tournaments competing in a wide variety of sports. Football is our strength and our pupils regularly get into the finals or win in this area.

Staff see the importance of sport and the part it plays in achieving a healthy lifestyle. Pupils are encouraged to participate in sport during our regular PE sessions and also out of school hours. There are a number of after school clubs run to a high standard to ensure that children have the opportunity to extend their enjoyment for PE, sport and physical activity. Furthermore, we are able to provide the children with the opportunity to experience a variety of sports and activities with outside coaches.

Objectives of Primary School Sports Funding for 2017/18

Our objectives as a school for 2017/18 were:

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity- kick starting healthy active lifestyles.
2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
5. Increased participation in competitive sport.

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Summary of PSSG Spending for 2017/18

Children have participated in sporting activities during after school clubs. These clubs have provided specific training in a wide range of sporting activities and enabled children to progress in terms of their skills and knowledge of the sport.

Opportunities to compete with other teams from across the Bradford district have been successful and pupils have demonstrated excellent team spirit and motivation to achieve.

Play equipment has been purchased for use at playtimes and lunchtimes. Lunchtime staff have received training on using this equipment by the Sports Coach and our Pastoral Officers.

A residential was partly funded using PSSG money. Our pupils experienced a variety of outdoor activities and sports and these experiences were utilised to support other areas of learning, especially in their writing.

Implications for PSSG in 2018/19

- Plan further CPD opportunities for PE teaching in 2018/19.
- To reduce percentage of childhood obesity 2018 Public Health England research showed that in FS2 9% of our children are obese compared to 21% in Bradford and 22% nationally. In Year Six 44% of our pupils are obese or overweight compared to 37% in Bradford and 34% nationally. Vulnerable children will be identified and attend additional sporting activities as appropriate.
- Continue to build on improving provision of activities during playtimes/lunchtimes.
- Establish high level competitive tournaments for gifted pupils in a wide variety of sports.
- Develop further club links.
- To educate our pupils further about healthy lifestyles and nutrition.
