

Primary School Sports Grant Impact and Evaluation Report Academic Year 2020/21

Context of Academy

Whetley Academy is situated in inner city Bradford. We are a large two/three form entry school.

The school has two halls, one situated in the KS1 building and one in the KS2 building. We also have two football pitches which we use for a wide range of sports and two main playground areas.

Whetley Academy has strong links with other Bradford schools. Throughout the year our pupils attend tournaments virtually competing in a wide variety of sports. Football is our strength and our pupils regularly get into the finals or win in this area.

Staff see the importance of sport and the part it plays in achieving a healthy lifestyle. Pupils are encouraged to participate in sport during our regular PE sessions and also out of school hours. There are a number of after school clubs run to a high standard to ensure that children have the opportunity to extend their enjoyment for PE, sport and physical activity. Furthermore, we are able to provide the children with the opportunity to experience a variety of sports and activities with outside coaches.

Our objectives as a school for 2020/21 were:

- To provide coaching in a variety of sports and opportunities to compete with other Delta Bradford/Leeds academies
- To provide opportunities for pupils to practise their skills in preparation for team sports.
- To provide increased and enhanced participation opportunities for children through after school clubs.
- To broaden the experiences of outdoor activities for pupils.
- To provide opportunities for all children to partake in daily exercise.
